We ask you to please plant only native wild flowers at Humber Woodland of Remembrance.

Some examples of native wild flowers:

Primroses:	Pale yellow - not pink, red or purple
Cowslips:	Pale yellow - not pink, red or purple
Wild Daffodils:	Native Narcissus pseudonarcissus only - no Tete a Tete or
	other garden variety.
Snowdrops:	Single flowers - not double
Meadow Cranesbill: Geranium pratense – if it has another name as well, it isn't	
	the native species.
Tansy:	Tanacetum vulgare
Agrimony:	Agrimonia eupatoria
Red campion:	Silene dioica
Betony:	Stachys officinalis – pink flowers in Summer
Field Scabious:	<i>Knautia arvensis</i> – purple flowers in late Summer. Be sure to get the native variety, not a garden one.

Please understand: If we find any non-native plants we must take them out, so please check first before buying or planting, as it is upsetting for you and us if we have remove your plants.

Garden Centres don't often have wild flowers, so we suggest buying at our Planting Days in March and September, when there will be a good selection of locally grown native wild flowers to choose from.
