

## PLANTING WILD FLOWERS AT HUMBER WOODLAND OF REMEMBRANCE

**We ask you to please plant only native wild flowers at Humber Woodland of Remembrance.**

Some examples of native wild flowers:

- Primroses: Pale yellow - **not** pink, red or purple  
Cowslips: Pale yellow - **not** pink, red or purple  
Wild Daffodils: Native *Narcissus pseudonarcissus* only - no Tete a Tete or other garden variety.  
Snowdrops: Single flowers - **not** double  
Meadow Cranesbill: *Geranium pratense* – if it has another name as well, it isn't the native species.  
Tansy: *Tanacetum vulgare*  
Agrimony: *Agrimonia eupatoria*  
Red campion: *Silene dioica*  
Betony: *Stachys officinalis* – pink flowers in Summer  
Field Scabious: *Knautia arvensis* – purple flowers in late Summer. Be sure to get the native variety, not a garden one.

**Please understand: If we find any non-native plants we must take them out, so please check first before buying or planting, as it is upsetting for you and us if we have remove your plants.**

Garden Centres don't often have wild flowers, so we suggest buying at our Planting Days in March and September, when there will be a good selection of locally grown native wild flowers to choose from.
